How Do I Register?

Who Do I Pay?

Please make checks payable to Pine Island Community Education. Checks will be deposited when received. If a class is cancelled a refund check will be distributed.

When Can I Sign Up?

Registration begins immediately. If space is still available in a class, registrations are taken as long as possible, depending on the supplies needed by the instructor. Early registrations help fill classes on time and reduce the chances that the class will be cancelled. If the class minimum is not met, classes will be cancelled one week prior to the start date.

Refunds

If you cannot attend a class, you will receive a refund up to one week prior to the class unless an earlier deadline is specified. After that date your refund will be based on supplies or fees already incurred. Trips cannot be refunded after the registration closes.

HELP ME GROW

As you watch your child grow, you may have questions about your child's development. While all young children grow and change at their own rate, sometimes you may have concerns that your child is developing differently than other children the same age as your child.

If you have concerns about your child's development, call 1-866-693-GROW (4769) or visit the helpmegrowmn.org website to refer your child.



Once a referral is made through Help Me Grow, the local school district will contact you to arrange for a screening or evaluation to determine if your child is eligible for Infant and Toddler Intervention or Preschool Special Education services in Minnesota.

Early Childhood Screening



January 18th, March 6th & 7th

Location: Pine Island Early Learning Center (212 1st Ave SE)

Early Childhood Screening is a free check of a child's growth and development provided by Pine Island Public Schools. Screening in early childhood supports readiness for kindergarten and promotes positive child health and development. If any areas of concern are identified, children can get the help they need before starting school. **Children are required to have a screening before kindergarten entrance,** unless a conscientious objection is filed.

The next Early Childhood Screening is being held **January 18th and March 6th &** 7th at the Pine Island Early Learning Center.

This screening is for any <u>unscreened</u> child who:

- •Is between the ages of three and four.
- •Is over four and has not yet been screened

Screening at age three is ideal, as it provides the earliest time to offer support and resources to children and families. The screening tools are adjusted for a child's age, so waiting for a child to learn more skills before screening is not recommended and provides no benefit. It can also delay care for any areas that may be of concern.

The screening includes height and weight, vision and hearing, and a developmental screening, which looks at the child's thinking, language and motor skills. Parents will also have a health and immunization review with a nurse, followed by an exit interview. Early childhood screening includes a vision screening that helps detect potential eye problems, but is not a substitute for a comprehensive eye exam.

Call Community Education at 356-8876 to schedule your appointment. Appointment times range from 8:00 AM until 2:00 PM and take about 1.5 hours. Attending any preschool or ECFE classes or having well child check-ups with your doctor does not eliminate the requirement for screening.


